DAY1	Kyoto Nijyojyo	Nijyo Castle (Nijyojyo) was built in 1603 as the Kyoto residence of Ieyasu Tokugawa, the first shogun of Edo Period (1603-1867). His grandson Iemitsu completed the castle's palace buildings 23 years later and further expanded the castle by adding a five story castle keep. We do a shooting of Karamon Gate that cars are parked in front of and Higashi Ote Gate that cars depart from.
	Hieizan-Enryakuji / Hieizan-Driveway	<u>Hieizan-Enryakuji</u> is located in Kyoto's eastern mountain range on Mount Hieizan, Enryakuji is one of the most important monasteries in Japanese history and the headquarters of the Tendai sect of Japanese Buddhism. Many influential monks studied at Enryakuji, including the founders of a number of later sects, such as the Pure Land (Jodo), Zen and Nichiren sects. <u>Hieizan Driveway</u> is a drive course 8.1km in length, allowing you to simultaneously enjoy the beautiful scenery of the old city of Kyoto and the elegant glory of Lake Biwa.
	Omihachiman	Omihachiman, that sits at the foot of Mt. Hachiman in the center of Shiga, is a castle town of Hachiman-yama-jo. The castle was built in 1585 on the eastern shore Japan's largest lake, Lake Biwa. The quaint streets with lattice windows, the pine trees stretching out from the gardens of private residence, 'udatsu' (roof of unusual shape).
	Taga-Taisha Shrine	It is the oldest shrine in Shiga Prefecture and is commonly known as O-taga-san. The shrine is dedicated to the creator gods Izanami-no-mikoto and Izanagi-no-mikoto in Japan's oldest book the "Kojiki" and visiting the shrine is said to bring long life, luck in marriage, and protection from evil. The approach to the shrine has many torii and many souvenir shops are set up here.
	La Collina	La Collina means hill in Italian, giving a clue to the Architect's intentions, with its hill like roof covered by a lush lawn. Surrounded by forested mountains, it is a stone's throw from Lake Biwa, the largest lake in Japan. To Fujimori, nature and people are the protagonists of this building. Using materials from local forests, its assembly generated a community of human intellect and creativity.
	Kaga Yamashiro hot springs	Yamashiro hot springs is one of the largest hot spring resorts in Kaga City, Ishikawa Prefecture, an area in the Hokuriku region facing the Sea of Japan. It has a history of over 1,300 years and has retained much of the traditional culture.



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DAY2	Motorcar Museum of Japan	A Meiji Western style 3-story building with 250,000 red bricks. Inside this Museum, there are over 500 cars from the 1900s to the 1970s from around the world displayed in a 12,000m ² exhibition hall.
	Hakusan Shirakawa-go White Road (Jyadani Ohashi/Kunimi Observatory/Fukube Falls)	<p>It is a driving route through Hakusan National Park, connects points like the ancient city of Kanazawa and Hakusan and Kaga Onsen (Ishikawa Prefecture) with the World Heritage Site of Shirakawa-go and Hida Takayama (Gifu Prefecture).</p> 
	Kiso Road	The Kiso Road is one of the most beautiful sections of the Nakasendo Way. It ran between Japan's two leading cities; Edo, the headquarters of the Tokugowa clan of shoguns who ruled Japan during the Edo period, and Kyoto, the ancient capital of the figurehead emperor in who's name the shogun governed. It took the mountainous inland route and for much of its time followed the path of the Kiso river.
	Hida Takayama	It is a city in the mountainous Hida region of Gifu Prefecture that retains a traditional touch like few other Japanese cities, especially in its beautifully preserved old town.
	Narai-juku	It is a picture perfect small town in Nagano Prefecture, with very much the feel of an historical film set, on the Chuo Main Line railway in the Kiso Valley area of central Japan. It was confirmed as a Cultural Asset in the Groups of Traditional Buildings category of Cultural Properties of Japan in 1978 and is maintained by the Japanese government grant system.
	Karuizawa Marriott Hotel	Karuizawa Marriott Hotel is located in Naka-karuizawa, a quiet district in Karuizawa, a popular resort encompassing rich natural environment and chic townscape.



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DAY3	Chikuma View Line	It is a farm road that continues from Komori City to Ueda City in Nagano Prefecture. There are a few traffic lights on the road, so you can take photos of cars including a long road and beautiful tranquil green landscape.
	Tateshina Second Ranch	It is a ranch that you can see cattle and horses with Mt. Asama, Mt. Tateshina and the mountains of Gunma as well as alpine plants throughout the season. Along with the road in front of the ranch, there are many white birch trees.
	Suwa Taisha Shrine	Suwa Taisha is one of the oldest shrines in the country and represents more than 10,000 Suwa Shrines nationwide. The grand shrine is comprised of four shrines and we go to Kami-sha Hon-miya located in Suwa-shi, Nagano. There is a sacred tree of and hot spring water in the shrine. The area around Lake Suwa is a hot spring town, the hot spring in Suwa Taisha Shrine is believed as the source of Suwa's hot spring.
	Kirigamine Venus Line	Venus Line is a driving road 76km long, which starts from Chino City to Tadeshina Kogen, connecting Lake Shirakaba, Kurumayama Kogen, and Utsukushigahara. The panoramic mountain view of Lake Shirakaba and Mt. Fuji is especially beautiful.
	Yatsugatake Eco Line / Hachimaki Road	Yatsugatake Eco Line is a farm road that you can see Mt. Yatsugatake and the mountains of Sothern and Central Alps and Tateshina area. <u>Hachimaki Road</u> is a road that there are many trees that are probably ablaze with fall colors.
	Sengen Taisha Shrine	It is the head Shinto shrine located in Fujinomiya in Shizuoka Prefecture of the 1300 Sengen shrines in the country. You can see Mt. Fuji with the beautiful red tori gate from the shrine. The shrine building was rebuilt in 1804 and decorated with intricate carvings and colorful paint work both inside and outside.
	Asagiri Plateau	It is located at the southwest base of Mount Fuji in Fujinomiya, Shizuoka Prefecture. It is also richly utilized for its pasture land and many dairy farms are situated along it. Hope that we can take a breathtaking photo of Mt. Fuji
	Shuzenji Marriott Hotel	It is a brand-new hotel opened in July 28, 2017. It is located in Shuzenji area where you can enjoy the view of Mt. Fuji and Amagi mountain range. The concept of the hotel is "Forest of Izu" that gives time of rest and relaxation.



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DAY4	Izu Sky Line (Kurodake/Takichiyamaenchi observatory)	It is a famous mountain road through Izu Peninsula in Shizuoka Prefecture with stunning viewing points every few kilometers. You can do a shooting of mountain green view including Sagami bay from Kurodake and 360-degree panoramic views including Mt. Fuji, Suruga bay, Atami city and Sagami bay.
	Yokohama City	Yokohama is the second largest city in Japan with a population of over three million and located in where takes less than half an hour south of Tokyo by train. We do a shooting including the Cosmoclock 21 Ferris wheel that has a diameter of 100 meters symbolizing Yokohama city.
